Green Growth Program: Support provincial governments of Central and East Kalimantan to prioritize and implement green growth activities

Challenges

Though already a G-20 nation, Indonesia's growth has come at high social and environmental costs. In order to sustain development gained and reach identified goals that benefit all Indonesia's across the vast archipelago, the following challenges will need to be addressed:

- Capacity disparities across Indonesia to plan for and implement sustainable growth strategies
- Over reliance on extractive industries and infrastructure development for economic growth
- Social and environmental vulnerability to economic and climate shocks
- Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions
- Deforestation

Activities

The Government of Indonesia (GoI) recognizes that to become one of the top ten largest economies in the world by 2025, socially inclusive and environmentally sustainable growth needs to take root throughout the Indonesia. In support of this goal, GGGI is providing technical support to the regional Development Planning Agencies (BAPPEDA) in both Central Kalimantan and East Kalimantan provinces. The Central and East Kalimantan provinces project is:

- Supporting the mainstreaming of green growth into mid-term development plans
- Conducting green growth project assessments
- Developing green technology business cases
- Providing REDD+ support
- Developed unique, province-specific engagement strategies

Overall Objectives

- Support the integration of green growth mainstreaming activities and REDD+ initiatives into sub-national (i.e. provincial and district-level) planning

Implementing Partners

- Ministry of National Development Planning – regional agencies
- Provincial governments in Central Kalimantan and East Kalimantan

Results to Date

- Publication of "Central Kalimantan: Moving towards Green Growth Report"
- Adoption of landuse investment opportunities for sustainable SMEs on small patches of degraded land into the planning documents of East Kalimantan's Agriculture Agency
- Establishment of a district-level Green Growth Working Group in Central Kalimantan
- Integration of green growth into East Kalimantan development and strategic plans
- Development of green growth strategy for the District Murung Raya, Central Kalimantan
- Development of green growth strategy for the district Pulang Pisau, Central Kalimantan
