

# Green Growth Knowledge Platform Conference January 12-13, 2012 Mexico City, Mexico

The Green Growth Knowledge Platform (GGKP) will hold its inaugural conference January 12-13, 2012, in Mexico City Mexico. The conference aims to (i) take stock of the current understanding of the economics of green growth; (ii) engage researchers and practitioners in an ongoing dialogue to increase understanding of how green growth approaches can be applied in the field; (iii) identify knowledge gaps and establish priorities for knowledge-building work and implementation; and (iv) launch follow-on efforts. The conference is being coordinated with Mexico's National Institute of Ecology (INE), as well as the OECD, UNEP, and World Bank offices in Mexico City. The conference location will allow attendees to benefit from Mexico's experiences from taking a leading role international in advocating pathways to green development.

The conference will bring together leading scholars and experienced practitioners to address a number of potential connections linking economic growth and environmental resource management. These linkages are found in a number of topic areas, including:

- Innovation
- Trade
- Natural resource management
- Infrastructure and urban development
- Employment and poverty
- · Ecosystem resilience
- Human behavior
- Welfare measurement

To accomplish this, top-level economics researchers will present general-audience summaries taking stock of current knowledge and how available research can contribute to understanding and implementing different aspects of green development. Additional view on areas where research efforts are needed will be provided by practitioners from international organizations and other institutions. Commentaries on the presentations by experienced decision makers from developing countries will initiate broader dialogue on the research conclusions that will be presented and their applicability<sup>1</sup>. To the extent possible, discussant roles will be filled by practitioners and decision makers from developing countries.

During the second day, attendees will be grouped into breakout discussions organized around some general topical themes. Participants will discuss the priority of the various themes for advancing knowledge and practice concerning green growth, reviewing key knowledge gaps and challenges for the themes. Breakout group discussions will feed into the conference's concluding plenary session.

The first meeting of GGKP's Advisory Committee will immediately follow the concluding plenary. Based on the outcome of the knowledge assessment and discussion at the conference, the Advisory Committee will recommend to GGKP's governing Steering Committee a set of priority analytical and implementation activities to be fostered by GGKP's constituent organizations and their partners.

GGKP would like to acknowledge the invaluable support of INE and the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development, without whom this conference would not be possible.
