GGKP Impact Report 2020

ABOUT THE GGKP IMPACT REPORT

The Green Growth Knowledge Partnership (GGKP) aims to help bring about a green economy transition by facilitating collaboration in knowledge generation, knowledge management and knowledge sharing among leading policy, industry and finance institutions and experts. The partnership is committed to tracking, measuring and analysing its efforts, with results compiled and reported on through both its Biennial Reports and Impact Reports.

The GGKP Impact Report 2020 outlines how the partnership has performed over the course of the year, focusing on the GGKP's main indicators of success. Drawing together analytics and analysis across the GGKP's three work areas—generating knowledge, managing knowledge and sharing knowledge—the report provides a concise evaluation of the partnership's impact. This includes summaries of key achievements and how these efforts will be complemented by future planned activities.

Highlights from 2020 include the launch of the Green Learning Network and Green Finance Measure Database update, as well as the creation of "+Platforms" that provide partner initiatives with dedicated websites in the GGKP knowledge management ecosystem. Participation in the GGKP webinar series also increased significantly, especially during the COVID-19 global health pandemic, where professional engagement and discussions on key issues shifted from in-person to online events.





The GGKP is a global network of experts and organizations dedicated to providing the policy, business and finance communities with knowledge, guidance and tools to transition to an inclusive green economy.

The GGKP was founded in 2012 and is led by a Steering Committee of senior representatives from the Global Green Growth Institute (GGGI), Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) and the World Bank.

Building on the success of the <u>Green Growth Knowledge Platform</u>, a Green Industry Platform and Green Finance Platform were launched in 2019 at the UN High-level Political Forum on Sustainable Development.




The <u>Green Industry Platform</u> is a userfriendly online database of information, tools and practical guidance to help small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) become more efficient, competitive and sustainable.



The <u>Green Finance Platform</u> provides bank, insurance and investment firms with a "one-stop shop" for the latest financial sector innovations to start, scale and measure their contributions to a green economic transition.

Together, the three knowledge platforms offer quick and easy access to the latest research, case studies, guidance, tools and courses to empower policymakers and advisers, SMEs, banks, and insurance and investment firms to make evidence-based decisions about how to green their operations.

To date, the GGKP has a global partnership of over 75 international organizations, research institutes and think tanks. To achieve impact, the GGKP engages in three workstreams:



To support its work, the GGKP has a number of resources at its disposal, including its core and programmatic funding from donors and partners, in-kind contributions of staff time from its Steering Committee members, expertise and engagement of its Knowledge Partners and Senior Advisory Group, a dedicated Secretariat focused on the day-to-day management of the initiative, and contributions from a growing green growth community of practice.

In 2017, the GGKP Steering Committee members agreed to a four-year GGKP Strategy and Work Programme (2018–2021) to scale its activities.

GENERATING KNOWLEDGE

Major indicators of success

The GGKP assesses its knowledge generation impact by tracking the number of:

- Green economy knowledge products collaboratively generated
- Green economy knowledge products collaboratively generated that reflect a social inclusion or gender dimension

The GGKP works on the principle of collaborative knowledge generation. Guided by this principle, it brings together practitioners, researchers and partner representatives into regular, neutral and inter-institutional expert groups aimed at spurring collective action for green growth.

To date, the GGKP has supported nine Expert Groups on the following themes:

- behavioural insights
- fiscal instruments
- green growth and the law
- inclusiveness
- metrics and indicators
- natural capital
- sustainable infrastructure
- trade and competitiveness
- technology and innovation

These groups have drawn together 229 experts from 46 GGKP partner organizations with a high developing country representation (34%) and female expert participation (34%). Three out of four expert group members are a GGKP Knowledge Partner representative. Such diversity helps to ensure the relevance of the working groups' recommendations to policy changes required on the ground.

The success of GGKP's knowledge generation is partly measured by the number of gap analyses and research papers developed, released and made available for download. The GGKP Expert Groups have released 20 working papers and contributed to the development of 24 collaborative research papers with partners.

Since 2018, the GGKP has increasingly focused on mainstreaming natural capital in green growth, working with the GGKP Natural Capital Expert Group and partners to identify implementation-oriented knowledge gaps and address them through institutional and in-country knowledge application.





As part of efforts to mainstream a natural capital approach, the GGKP worked in partnership with GGGI to develop a new capitals-based approach to sustainable landscape planning, which was applied and tested in Myanmar. The collaboration yielded two additional reports published jointly with GGGI.





Each of the seven reports listed above broadly addresses the social inclusiveness and gender implications of nature-based green growth. In addition, the GGKP—in partnership with GGGI—is seeking to extend its experience with the <u>GGKP Inclusiveness Expert Group</u> to support a new expert group focused on gender and green growth.

Economics for Nature Initiative

<u>Economics for Nature (E4N)</u> is a six-year programme of work being led by the Green Economy Coalition and its partners, the GGKP, Capitals Coalition and WWF-France. The project aims to encourage robust natural capital approaches and support the internalization of the value of nature in development, economic, spatial and green growth planning processes.

The initiative convenes experts, academics and decision-makers from the policy, industry and finance communities to build consensus for mainstreaming natural capital in green growth planning. In support of this goal, E4N also supports knowledge generation and application for national decision-making based on the latest natural capital methodologies, data and policy practices, including demonstrated examples of successful economic reform based on natural capital principles.

Major indicators of success

The GGKP assesses its knowledge management impact by tracking the number of:

- Green growth knowledge products available through the GGKP web platforms
- Knowledge products available on the web platforms that include a gender, poverty, or social equity focus
- Monthly visits to the GGKP web platforms

The GGKP's knowledge management workstream aims to provide policymakers and practitioners with guick and easy access to knowledge, guidance, data and tools to transition to an inclusive green economy. The GGKP's three knowledge platforms-Green Growth Knowledge Platform, Green Industry Platform and Green Finance Platform—are the world's leading source of knowledge on green growth.

Green Growth Knowledge Partnership

At the end of 2020, the GGKP featured **6.563 knowledge products** on its three platforms, including research, case studies, guidance, tools and courses from more than 1,000 organizations across a total of 50 sector and thematic pages and 193 country pages. Of these, **384 knowledge products** include a gender, poverty, or social equity focus.

Green Growth Knowledge Platform

At the end of 2020, the Green Growth Knowledge Platform featured more than 4.842 green growth knowledge products, across 37 sector and thematic pages. Of these, 363 knowledge products include a gender, poverty, or social equity focus.

In 2020, the Green Growth Knowledge Platform experienced a 36% increase in unique users, and 37% of users were first-time visitors. This translated into a 20,000+ increase in unique visitors per quarter, with an average of 81,984 unique visitors per quarter.

The Green Growth Knowledge Platform made a number of improvements over the course of the year, including launching "+Platforms", which allow the GGKP to host

dedicated websites for leading green growth initiatives. This new service provides comprehensive and dynamic knowledge management services to partners. Some of the initiatives supported through this service in 2020 include: Global Opportunities for SDGs (GO4SDGs), Economics for Nature (E4N) and Partners for Inclusive Green Economy.

Also, in 2020, the GGKP's online resource library was replaced with a <u>Global Library</u> to provide users easy and immediate access to all of the GGKP's 4,000+ knowledge products, including research, case studies, guidance, and tools and platforms.

Green Industry Platform

Launched in 2019, the <u>Green Industry Platform</u> underwent a major reorganization in 2020 to better serve small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) and SME service providers. As part of this effort, the current knowledge database is being expanded to include information (case studies, technical guides and tools) and support services (training, financial incentives and technical assistance) that will form a virtual SME Operations Support Centre. The update also includes a new user-friendly interface to ensure SMEs can easily and quickly access the resources most relevant to their activities and location.

The Green Industry Platform is also developing a self-assessment tool—<u>the Integrated Greening Operations (I-GO) tool</u>—that will enable SMEs to quickly assess their resource efficiency status and direct them to the most relevant information and support services to implement recommended actions.

The Green Industry Platform currently hosts **1,055 knowledge products** and experienced a **61% increase in average monthly visits** from the previous year.

Green Finance Platform

At the end of 2019, the GGKP's Green Finance Platform, together with the UNEP Inquiry into the Design of a Sustainable Financial System initiative, launched the Green Finance Measures Database—a library of policy and regulatory measures across developed and developing countries that support green finance. As of December 2020, the database comprised 500+ policy and regulatory measures across 75 developed and developing countries. The total number of knowledge products featured in the Green Finance Platform is 1,942, and the platform experienced a 212% increase in average monthly visits as compared to 2019.


In 2020, the Green Finance Platform welcomed **17 new Knowledge Partners**, bringing the total to 31.


Dedicated COVID-19 Knowledge Hubs on GGKP platforms

The GGKP assesses its knowledge sharing impact by tracking the number of:

- Participants at GGKP in-person and virtual events (e.g. annual conferences, side events, webinars, etc.)
- Webinars organized with GGKP partner institutions
- Webinars that include a social inclusion or gender dimension

The GGKP's communications activities connect a dynamic global community to the most innovative and forward-thinking knowledge, guidance and tools for greening policy and practice, and for responding to emerging global challenges. The GGKP measures the impact of these activities by tracking and analysing participation in GGKP webinars, trainings and virtual events. This includes GGKP Knowledge Update newsletters and subscribers, expert contributions to the GGKP Insights blog and levels of engagement on social media.

Sustainability After COVID-19:

Voices from Leading International Organizations GGGI, OECD, UNEP and the World Bank



21 April 2020 3pm CEST

In 2020, the GGKP organized **25 events** drawing together **7,646 participants**. These included 22 webinars, 3 online trainings and 2 events organized jointly with GGKP partners: the African Green Economy Forum—a three-month online exchange that brought together leading experts to explore how African countries are pioneering the transition to greener, fairer economies—and a side event at the High-level Political Forum for Sustainable Development.

Many GGKP events in 2020 centred on the COVID-19 pandemic, as part of the partner-ship's concerted effort to contribute to the global response. The 10-part #GGKPwebinar series Sustainability After COVID-19 invited experts from leading institutions to discuss the impacts of the pandemic on such issues as poverty, gender, waste, nature, global supply chains, and the Green New Deal movement. Discussions focused on what it would take to achieve an inclusive, green recovery, including fiscal policies, sustainable finance, green buildings and construction, and more. The series generated a tremendous amount of interest and engagement, with over 4,415 participants taking part.


#GO4SDGs at the High-level Political Forum on Sustainable Development

In 2020, the GGKP held a side event at the High-level Political Forum on Sustainable Development entitled "Recovering better: Global Opportunities for Jump-starting the Real Economy" to support the launch of the Global Opportunities for SDGs (#G04SDGs) initiative's menu of services. The event drew together 424 participants and presented a range of available tools and services offered by #G04SDGs partners to support governments, businesses and youth to accelerate the transition to inclusive green economies and sustainable living.

The GGKP supported additional #GO4SDGs activities in 2020, including major outreach campaigns centred on UNEP's <u>Anatomy of Action</u>, <u>Little Book of Green Nudges</u> and <u>Food Waste Index</u>. #GO4SDGs was <u>launched</u> in 2019 by UNEP and the Federal Ministry for the Environment, Nature Conservation and Nuclear Safety (BMU) of Germany in collaboration with the GGKP and other initiatives.

In November 2020, the GGKP—together with the Partnership for Action on Green Economy (PAGE) and United Nations Institute for Training and Research (UNITAR)—launched the <u>Green Learning Network</u>, a dedicated space where education and training professionals from around the world can find a range of green learning resources and events, share information, ask advice and learn from one another. The GLN consists of a Learning Hub that compiles green learning courses, programmes, institutions, scholarships, publications and other resources, and a community for practitioners to exchange information. The network will ultimately contribute to building a critical mass of knowledge and skills to advance green economy policies and actions.

GGKP and E4N partners hold Africa Green Economy Forum


In collaboration with Economics for Nature (E4N) project partners and the African Development Bank (AfDB), the GGKP co-organized the African Forum on Green Economy—a three-month online exchange (May-July 2020) that brought together leading experts to explore how African countries are pioneering the transition to greener, fairer economies. The forum featured dedicated sessions on such themes as integrating the value of water into business operations and decisions, inclusive and sustainable approaches to agriculture, data for natural capital decision-making and enabling change in the African context. The African Forum also served as the launch pad for the Natural Capital Accounting Community of Practice for Africa, an essential step towards unifying governments, institutions and other key African stakeholders around a shared ambition to accelerate the uptake of the natural capital approach in the regions.


The GGKP tracks its impact through data from in-person interviews, surveys, web analytics and social media analysis.






TRACKING PROGRESS ON THE GGKP KNOWLEDGE PLATFORMS







User increase (327,937 users in total)




First-time visitors (439,291 visits in total)




Monthly new visitors (2013-2020)




Quarterly unique visitors (2013-2020)

WHAT TO LOCK FOR IN 2021

The GGKP will focus on expanding its support for the generation, management and sharing of knowledge in 2021.

In particular, the GGKP will work with its partners to build global momentum for mainstreaming natural capital in national planning. The GGKP and the Economics for Nature initiative are building a growing consortium of global institutions dedicated to integrating natural capital approaches in global green growth. These include the African Development Bank, OECD, GGGI and a number of additional institutions that make up the GGKP Natural Capital Expert Group. Joining with the MAVA Foundation and GIZ, the GGKP looks forward to expanding its work in 2021, particularly around natural capital-based development finance in Africa and direct national support to countries adopting natural capital investment as a tool to achieve the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

The GGKP will also continue to strengthen its platforms in the coming year. The Green Industry Platform will finalize development and begin pilot phase deployment of an Integrated Greening Operations (I-GO) solution for SMEs. Through an easy-to-use self-assessment tool, the I-GO tool has been designed to build on the vast amount of support services—SME networks, financial solutions, training programmes and technical assistance—from leading organizations and experts and tailor them to the specific needs of individual SMEs. The pilot phase will launch in countries in Africa, Latin America and the Caribbean, and Eastern Europe and Central Asia.

In early 2021, the GGKP will officially launch an interactive, online community space. The Green Forum will provide professionals with an opportunity to share and discuss insights on a range of themes and issues in the pursuit of a sustainable economic transformation. It will include active community discussions on key green growth topics and will also provide organizations and individuals with the ability to create and manage their own public or private groups to support collaboration on projects and initiatives. The Green Forum is supported by the Partnership for Action on Green Economy (PAGE), Federal Ministry for the Environment, Nature Conservation and Nuclear Safety of Germany (BMU), and Federal Office for the Environment of Switzerland.

The GGKP will continue to support the #GO4SDGs initiative, particularly for the rollout of five regional road-maps for mainstreaming sustainable consumption and production in climate action, advancing SMEs financing for circularity and innovation, and empowering youth for sustainable lifestyles.

The GGKP will also continue to convene thought leaders to explore innovative, green economy-centred solutions to longstanding and emerging sustainable development challenges through the #GGKPwebinar series and Insights blog.

Finally, to strengthen the brand of the Green Growth Knowledge Partnership and to avoid confusion with the same acronym, the Green Growth Knowledge Platform will change its name in 2021 to the Green Policy Platform to be more consistent with the Green Industry Platform and Green Finance Platform. A new Green Policy Platform logo will be created to distinguish it from the GGKP logo and a new GGKP website will be created to feature information about the partnership, including links to the three platforms and the Green Forum.
