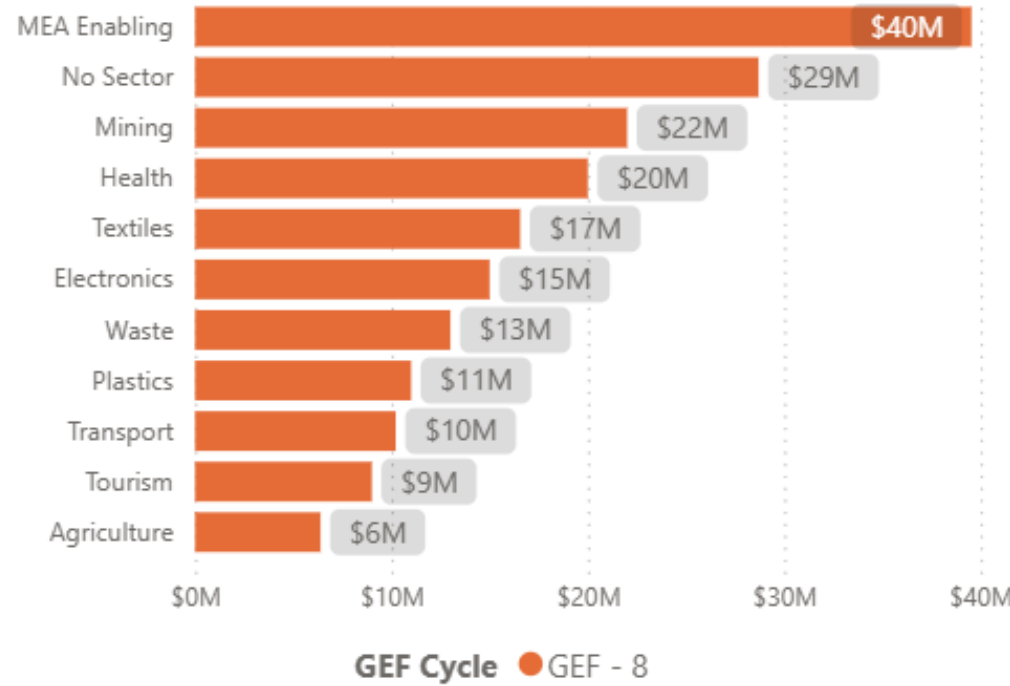

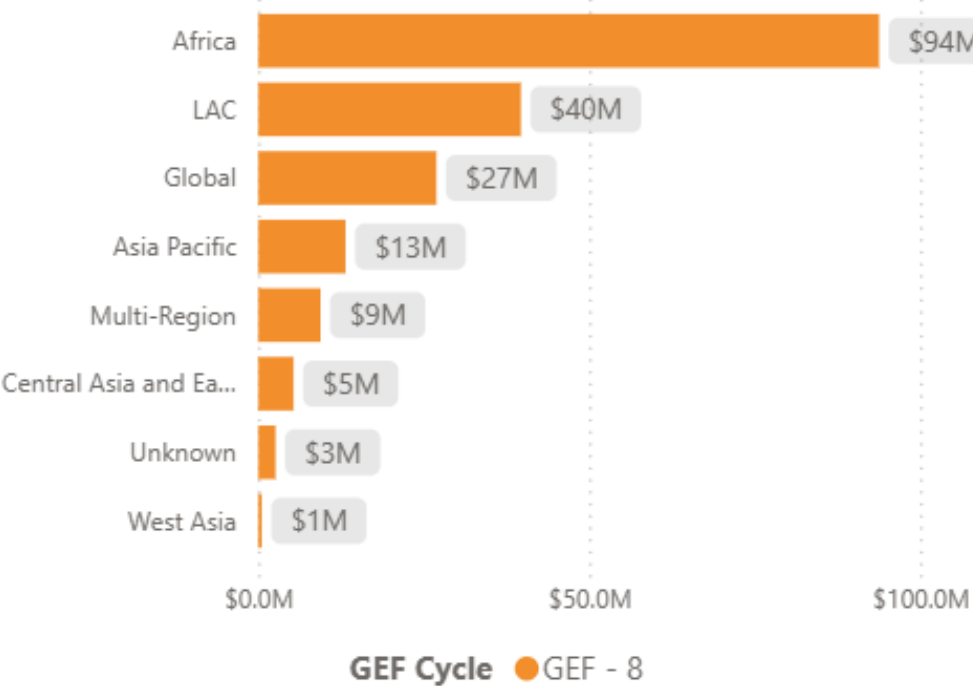

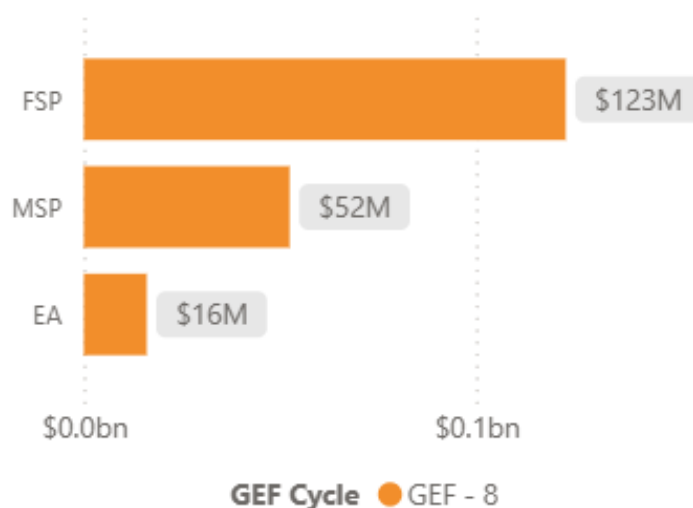
Sum of Fund by Sector and GEF Cycle



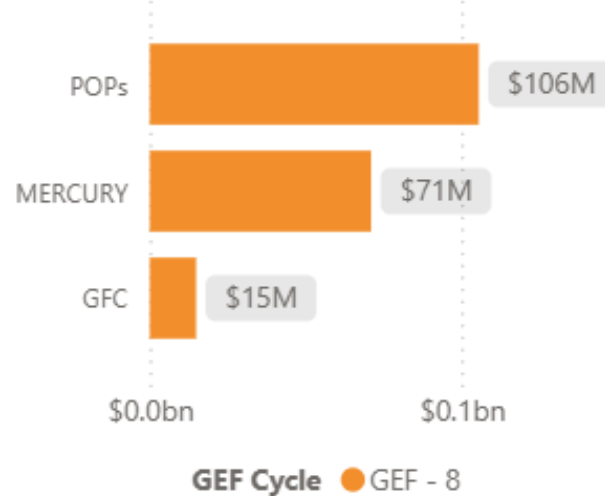
Fund Distribution by Region and GEF Cycle



Sum of Fund by Project Type and GEF Cycle

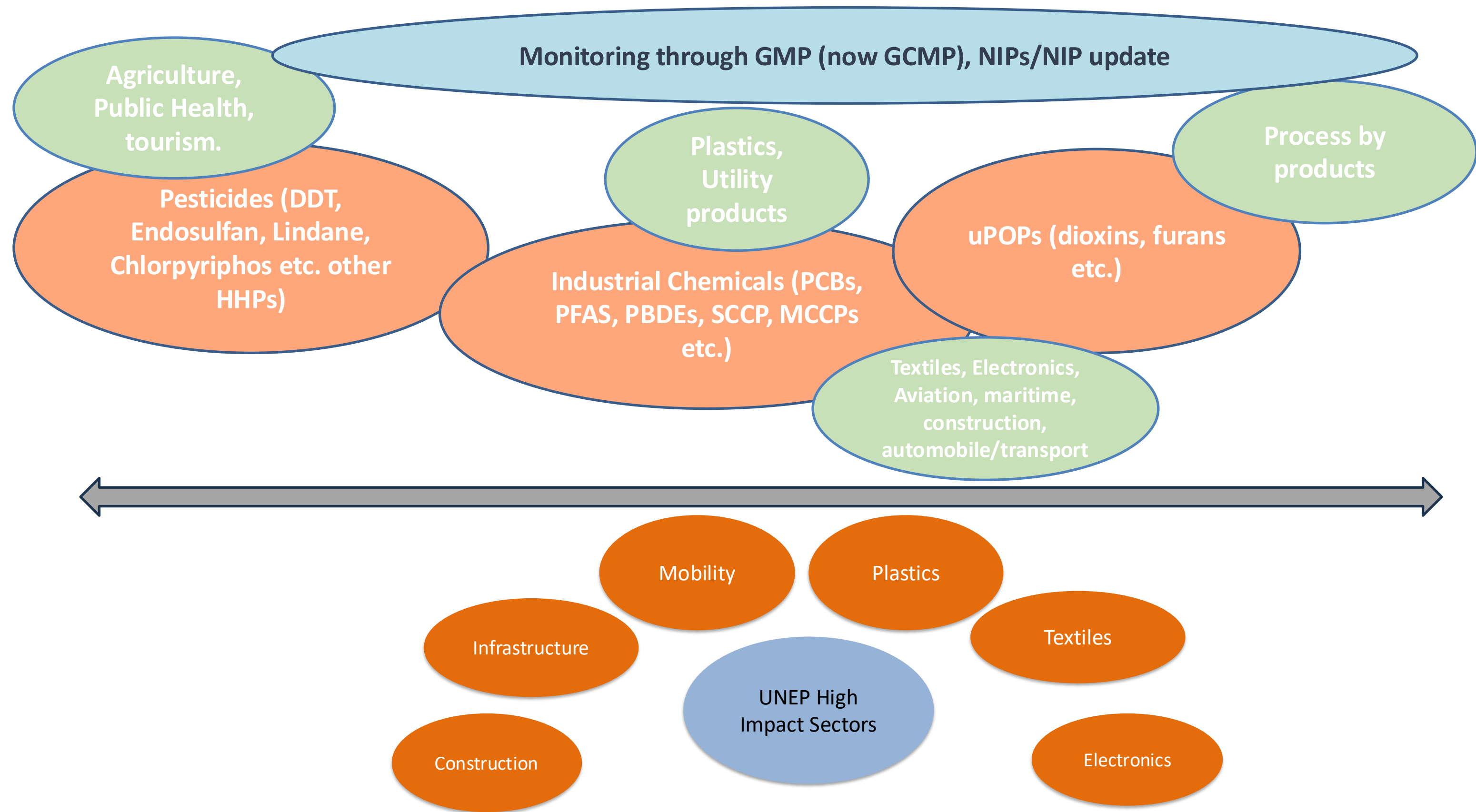

Our work stream: Stockholm Convention





Article 7 of Stockholm Convention mandates parties to

- (a) Develop a NIP describing the measures for implementing their obligations under the Convention;
- (b) Review and update their NIPs regularly
- (c) Transmit its implementation plan to the Conference of the Parties within two years of the date on which this Convention enters into force for it;
- (d) Review and update, as appropriate, its implementation plan on a periodic basis and in a manner to be specified by a decision of the Conference of the Parties.

Objectives

Facilitate the implementation of the Stockholm Convention in participating countries through the development, review and update of the NIPs and submission to the Conference of the Parties (COP) of the Convention.

Links and Continuity with 10785



- ✓ Same overarching objective and compliance framework.
- ✓ Direct continuation of Convention obligations.
- ✓ NIP II institutionalizes and continues the methodology developed under 10785.
- ✓ NIP II continues piloting and refining sectoral inventory approaches
- ✓ NIP II upgrades tools created under 10785.
- ✓ NIP II updates and disseminates knowledge products (webinars, policy briefs, case studies and outreach activities) developed under 10785
- ✓ Expands toolkit use, integrates NIP findings and supports country implementation.
- ✓ Focus on sustaining national POPs data systems and institutional reporting mechanisms.
- ✓ Builds on earlier capacity (training on data interpretation, QA/QC, monitoring plans, toolkit use and reporting).
- ✓ Uses lessons learned from 10785 to improve methodologies and country support.

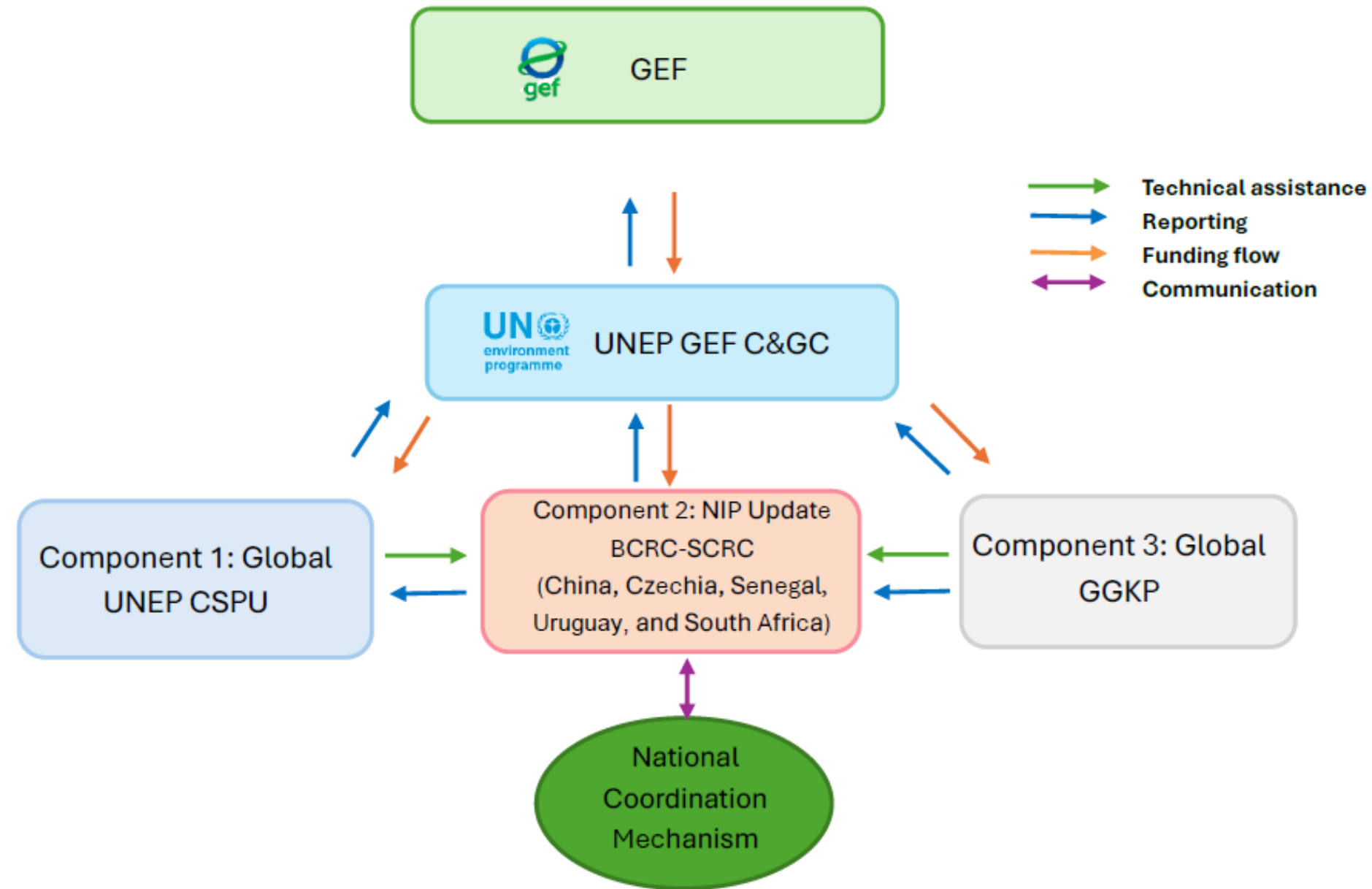

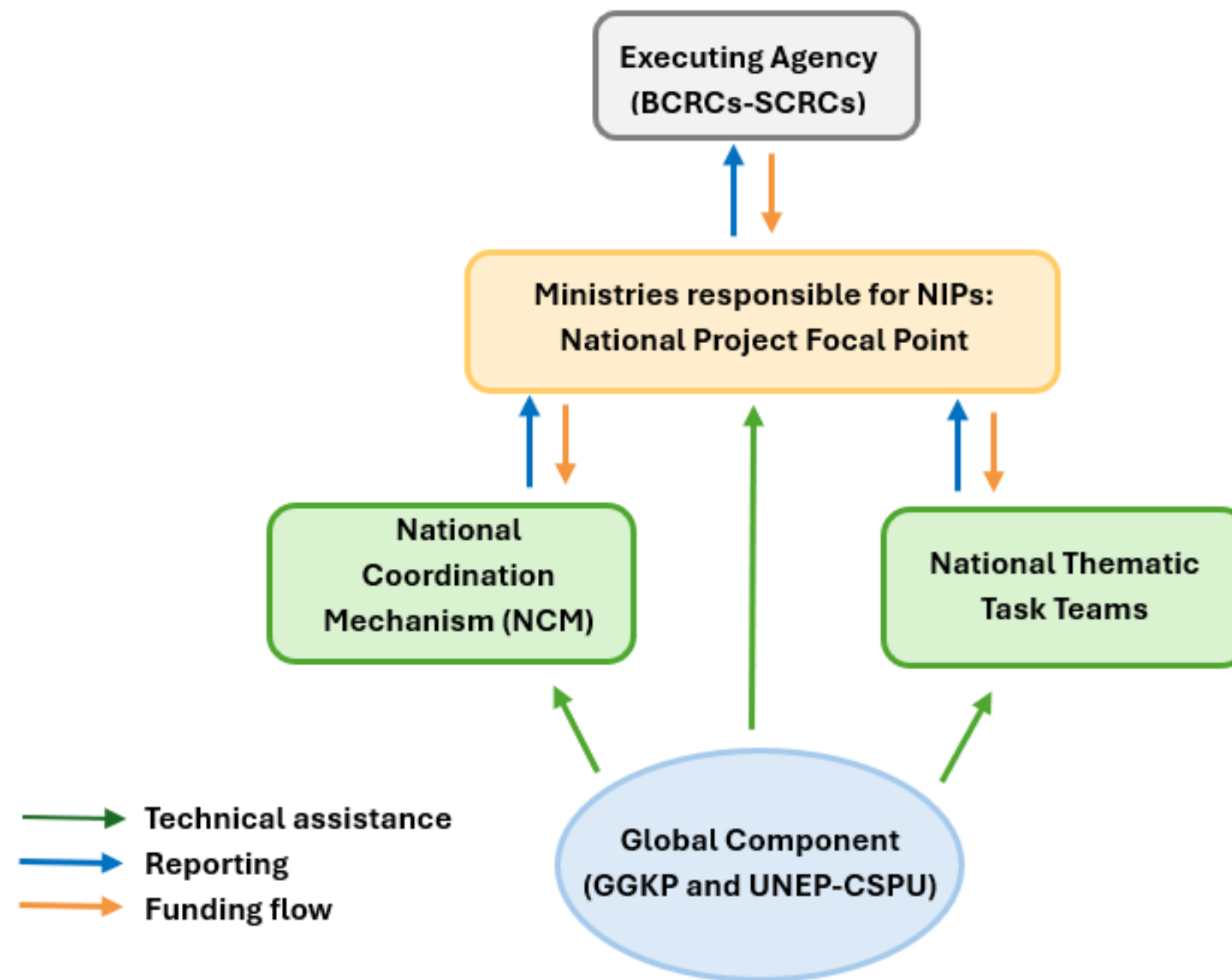

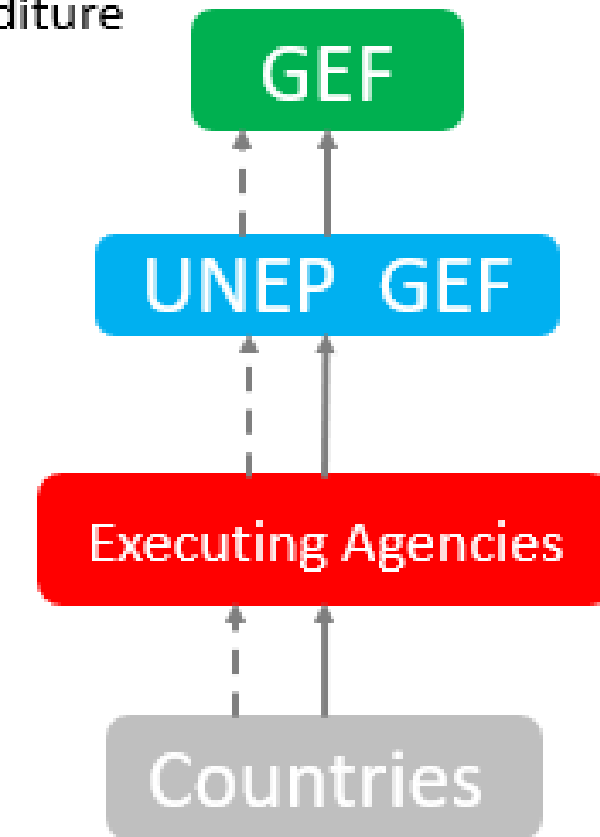
