UNEA-5 resolution 12 "Environmental Aspects of Minerals and Metals Management"

The UNEA-5 resolution focusses on improving the environmental aspects of minerals and metals along their full life cycle and requests UNEP, subject to available resources, to:

"...convene transparent and inclusive intergovernmental regional consultations, including with relevant international organizations, with regional and multilateral environmental agreements, and with relevant stakeholders acting as observers, to feed into a global intergovernmental meeting, with the aim of developing non-prescriptive proposals to enhance the environmental sustainability of minerals and metals along their full life cycle, in line with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development."



UNEA-5 resolution 12 "Environmental Aspects of Minerals and Metals Management"

- Requests the Executive Director, (...) to strengthen scientific, technical and policy
 knowledge with regard to sand, and to support global policies and action regarding the
 environmentally sound extraction and use thereof;
- Also requests the Executive Director, (...), to compile a report on knowledge gaps in relation to the environmental aspects of tailings management;

Format

- African States: Dakar, Senegal dates TBC
- Latin American and Caribbean States: dates and location TBC
- Global intergovernmental consultation 7-8 September 2023, Geneva, Switzerland



Development of Non-Prescriptive Proposals



 Potentially categorized by standards, regulations, financial, economic; technological; educational and informational, R&D

Potential topics

- Role of minerals, incl. construction materials, in disaster recovery and planning
- Sustainability standards
- Enhancing ESG approaches
- Advancing international collaboration on environmental due diligence
- Gaps in rehabilitation approaches: ASM, mine closure, recycling, LSM
- Environmental aspects of frontier issues in minerals and metals



Examples: Non-Prescriptive Proposals



- Stocktaking of existing national / international activities
- Establishment of a digital toolkit/online repository
- Developments of technical documents (including reports, analyses, assessments, guidelines/guidance) on any of the potential topics previously listed
- Creation of a cooperation and capacity-building platform to promote sharing/learning on technical, technological, and scientific cooperation
- Convening of a multistakeholder dialogue/initiative
- Establishment of a group of experts to provide strategic guidance in the development of any of the proposals/topics
- Mobilization of resources to scale up capacity-building, knowledge sharing and cooperation



Sand and Sustainability (OP4)





The Global Sand Observatory : a new UNEP/GRID-Geneva initiative

- Support countries for policy and regulatory coherence for sand extraction
- Contribution to knowledge base on sand extraction through data collection and publications
- Identifying and dissemination of best practices, standards and best solutions
- Awareness raising through webinars, media articles, events

Resolution

- Research on tailings management
- Raise awareness on environmental aspects of mine tailings
- Organization of **expert roundtables** on tailings management
- Report on knowledge gaps to be finalized in October 2023

Background

- Launch of the Global Industry Standard on Tailings Management, co-convened by UNEP, International Council on Mining and Metals and Principles for Responsible Investment (August 2020)
- Development of a compendium by Global Tailings Review
- UNEP and PRI support the process to establish an independent and multistakeholder Institute to oversee implementation of the Standard by mid-2023
